I refer to your initial correspondence to the UNSW Research Ethics & Compliance Support unit dated 08 October 2023, and your subsequent correspondence with Professor MacIntyre. Your concerns raised regarding the aforementioned project have been considered by the UNSW Human Research Ethics Committee (HREC) Executive.

I am confident that appropriate ethics approvals are in place for this research, and that potential impacts on participants were considered by the HREC during the approval process.
