Dear Sir,

I am writing further in regards to unacceptable environmental planned burn smoke which occurred right throughout the Tamar Valley on the 3/4/2009 and resulted in me suffering further breathing difficulties.

My complaint was taken and recorded at that time by Environmental and Public Health, The Environment Division, and the FPA.

I now have a report from the FPA claiming the smoke was not as a result of **forestry practices in the Tamar Valley**, however, you will notice from my emails this was not what I asked the FPA.

The smoke was so widespread and of such magnitude that I believe it did come from planned vegetation burns upwind of the Tamar Valley.

You only need to look at the attached photos taken on that day to realize the extent of the fine particle pollution we are being forced to breathe.

We now have the situation where the FPA does not accept responsibility for the smoke, however, it did not just happen by itself.

I am now writing to ask for your report in regards to the complaint I lodged with your department at the time, and if any action was taken by you in regards to it.

**Pic 2474** is a view from Grindelwald looking towards the Tamar River below and Launceston to the right. Both have been blanketed by heavy smoke.

**Pic 2460** is a view from Brady's Lookout on the West Tamar Highway North of Grindelwald looking North. The smoke is in the distance and coming right up into the trees below.

**Pic 2465** is a pic from Brady's Lookout towards Launceston. The city is normally visible beyond the trees but it is completely blanketed.

**Pic 2466** is a pic from Brady's Lookout towards Grindelwald on the hill. It is only 2Km away and is obscured by smoke.

**Pic 2462** is a pic looking across the Tamar river. Details have been lost by the smoke. No mountains are visible.

The smoke went as far north as the eye could see and extended well past Launceston to the south. It had claimed the whole Tamar Valley and east of the valley.

I look forward to hearing what you have to report, thank you.



As per attachment there were no forestry burns in the Tamar Valley on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> April. As the FPA is monitoring forestry burns only I cannot determine what other burning was occurring.

## **CSMS Registered Burns 03/04/2009**

NOTE: Point data shows location of point data source for the airshed as modelled by the bureau of meteorology not the location of burns.



As you are aware the FPA is monitoring compliance with planned forestry burns as part of the co-ordinated smoke management strategy. This information, together with expert review and information from the public will be used to improve the management of smoke in the future.

This information will be made publicly available on the FPA website at the completion of the planned forestry burn season.
